1875; founded La Société de Colonization de Manitoba (philantropic) 1874, and elected first Presdt. Apptd. a J.P. for Co. of Selkirk, 1874. A Commr. B.R. Contested Ste. Anne unsuccessfully at g.e. 1874. Elected by acclamation at g.e. 1878 for St. Boniface, the seat held up to that time by Hon. Senator Girard since the entry of the Prov. into the Confederation. Re-elected at last g.e., his opponent, Col. Provencher, only receiving 4 votes. A Libetal-Conservative in Dominion politics, and in favor of party lines on the same principle in local politics. In favor of encouraging colonization by opening rail and other road facilities, drainage, etc.; favors increase of school subsidies in order to raise the standard of education.—Corner of Provencher and Taché Avenues, St. Boniface, Manitabia.

LIPSETT, WESLEY F. (Woodlands.)

B. in the Co. Peel, Ont., 25 Oct. 1850. Resided in the town of Brampton, Ont., until July 1874, when he went to Manitoba. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Liberal-Conservative.—Meadow Lea, Man.

LOUGHLIN. ANDERW. (North Dufferin.)

B. in Co. York, Ont., 8 Oct. 1844. Went to Manitcha in June 1878. A farmer. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. Conservative.—
Belmont, Man.

McMicken, Gilbert. (Cartier.)

S. of Gilbert McMicken, Wigtonshire, Scot B. 1813. Came to Canada 1832. M. Ann Theresa, dau of Alexander Duff, Ess., and grand-dau. of Commodore Grant. Was District Councillor for District of Niagara, Warden of the United Counties of Lincoln and Welland; Mayor of Clifton; represented Co. of Welland in Assembly of Can. from 1857 to 1861. Was Collector of Customs and Postmaster at Clifton; Chairman of Erie and Ontario Railroad; patentee of two improvements in telegraphy 1847—the "transfer instrument" and "notifier;" was the first to span the Niagara river with a wire for any purpose. During the American civil war was specially appointed Stipendiary Magistrate for Canada West. Received special thanks from Lord Monck for efficient and discreet discharge of duty. As Commr. of Police for the Dominion, was
