An Act to abolish Wards in Townships, and to make Reeves and Deputy Reeves elective by the direct vote of the people in Upper Canada.

HEREAS it is expedient to abolish wards in townships, and to Preamble. provide for the election of Reeves and Deputy Reeves in the several townships, towns, and incorporated villages in Upper Canada, by a direct vote of the electors; Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with 5 the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

- 1. All wards heretofore established and now existing in the several wards townships in Upper Canada, are abolished, and all by-laws establishing abolished. the same are hereby repealed.
- 2. Whenever a township is divided into electoral divisions, and pollneeting places established therein, and Returning Officers established therefor, under and by virtue of the provisions of the two hundred and
 seventy-fifth section of chapter fifty-four of the Consolidated Statutes
 for Upper Canada, a meeting of the electors of such township shall be
 15 held on the last Monday but one in the month of December before the
 annual municipal election as provided by the said Act, at ten of the
 clock in the forenoon, for the nomination of a Reeve and four Councillors,
 or if the Township be entitled to a Deputy Reeve, for the nomination
 of a Reeve, Deputy Reeve, and three Councillors, to be elected for the
 20 said township, and such meeting shall be held at the Town Hall if there
 be one in the said township; but if there be no Township Hall, then at
 the place where the first meeting of the Council of the said Township where held,
 was held for the then current year; and the Township Clerk shall give and by whom
 the notice required by section ninety-seven of chapter fifty-four of the
 25 Consolidated Statutes for Upper Canada.
- 3. The Township Clerk shall preside at such meeting, or in case of who shall his absence through sickness or otherwise, the Council shall appoint a preside at person to preside in his place, and if the Township Clerk or the person such meeting, so appointed does not attend, the electors present shall choose from among themselves, a chairman, being an elector, to officiate.
 - 4. Such Township Clerk, or person so appointed, or chairman so His powers: chosen, shall, with respect to such meeting, have all the powers of a Returning Officer.
- 5. If, at such meeting, only one person be nominated for the office If there be 35 of Reeve or Deputy Reeve, and only the requisite number of persons only the required for councillors, within one hour of the opening of the meeting, ber of candidates.
