His Majesty's Post Office, but that it shall and may be lawful for Newspapers all Persons to send such printed Newspapers to and from Places through the beyond the Seas in any Manner they may find practicable or Post Office. convenient.

XIII. And be it further enacted, That in all Cases in which any Postmaster Dispute, Controversy, or Question shall arise whether any printed General, with Paper sent or offered to be sent by the Post, under the Provisions Concurrence of this Act or any other Act relating or referring to the Post Office, sury, may desist to be considered and deemed a Newspaper within the Intent and termine any Meaning of this Act or any other Act relating or referring to the Dispute or Post Office, or whether any such printed Paper is entitled to the Question as to what shall be deemed a Transmission of the same by the Post free of Postage, the Question Newspaper. shall be referred to the Judgment and Determination of the Postmaster General for the Time being, whose Decision, with the Concurrence of any Three or more of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, shall be final and conclusive on all Persons whomsoever.

XIV. And be it further enacted, That the several Rates and Rates to be Duties herein-before granted shall be paid from Time to Time carried to and into the Hands of the Receiver General for the Time being in form Part of England and Ireland of the Revenue of the Post Office, who shall dated Fund. pay the same (the necessary Charges for collecting, paying, and accounting for the same being first deducted) into the Receipt of His Majesty's Exchequer, on such Days and Times and in such Manner as the Rates and Duties of Postage by any Act or Acts in force at or immediately before the passing of this Act are directed to be paid; and the said Duties so to be paid into the said Receipt as aforesaid shall be carried to and made Part of the Consolidated Fund of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

XV. And be it further enacted, That no Action or Suit shall be Actions to be commenced against any Person or Persons for any thing done commenced in pursuance of this Act, unless within Three Calendar Months within Three Months after after the Right of Action shall have accrued, and the Defendant Right of Acor Defendants in such Action or Suit shall and may plead the tion accrues. General Issue, and give this Act and the special Matter in Evidence, and that the same was done in pursuance of and by the Authority of this Act; and if it shall appear so to be done, or the Action or Suit shall be commenced after the Time before limited for bringing the same, then the Jury shall find for the Defendant or Defendants; or if the Plaintiff or Plaintiffs shall be nonsuited, or discontinue his, her, or their Action or Suit after the Defendant or Defendants shall have appeared, or if upon Demurrer, Judgment shall be given against the Plaintiff or Plaintiffs, the Defendant or Defendants shall and may recover Treble Costs, and have the like Remedy for the same as any Defendant or Defendants hath or have in any other Cases by Law.
