Candidates congratulated

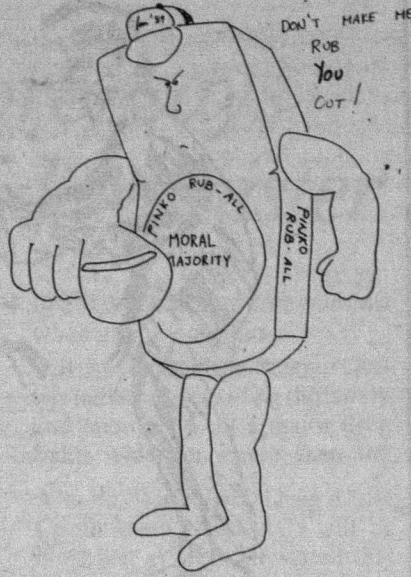
My recent candidacy in the Students' Union elections has been an incredibly interesting and enlightening experience.

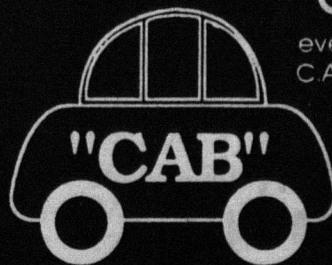

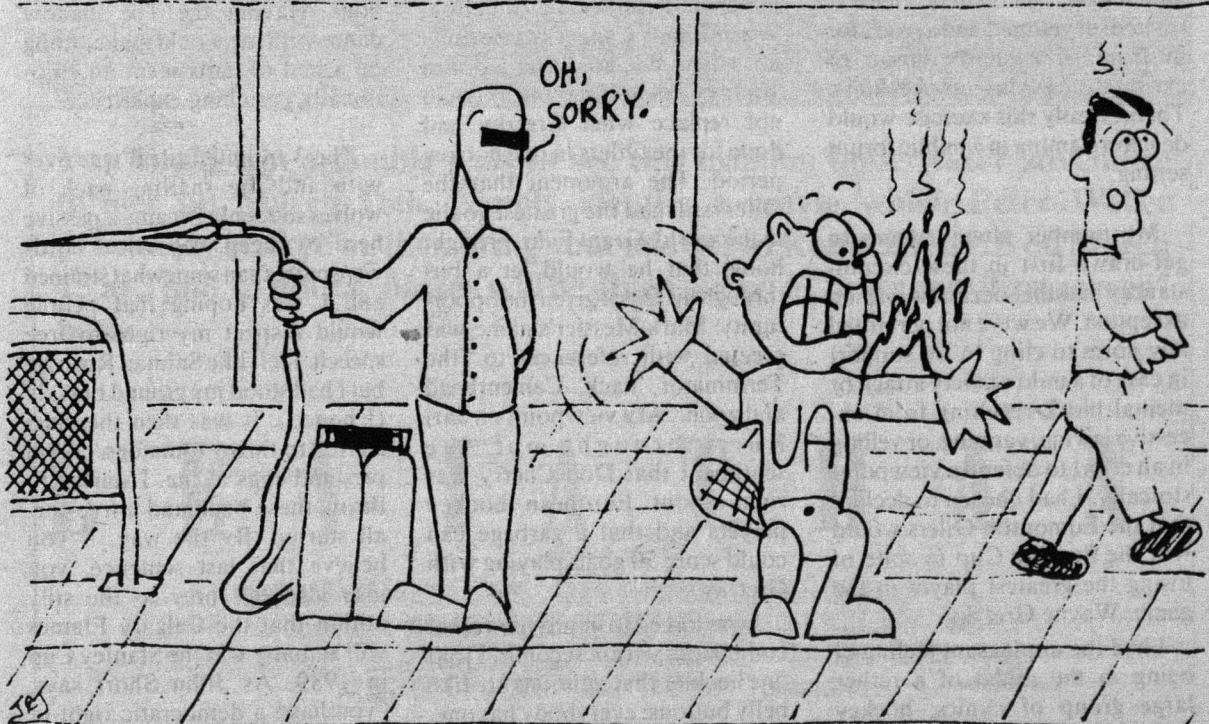
