Madigan murder case ended

PORT CREDIT Investigation into death of 17-year-old Karen Madigan January 5, 1968, in her Port Credit apartment, has ended for the present, according to Det. Sgt. Bill. Brooks of the Port Credit Police De-

partment.
"Officially, the books are still open," said Sgt. Brooks, "but we have no further leads to track down at this time."

The girl's semi-nude body was discovered between twin beds in the Lakeshore rd. e. apart-ment she shared with her mother, Mrs. James Madigan, and brother James. A pair of nylon hose was knotted tightly
