I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 16th instant No. L. 15269-09 in which you state that Mr.Surveyor Piton who has recently visited Weymontaching and Cou-Cou-Cache Indian Reserves says that it would appear that the Indians at threeplaceswould be pleased to surrender their Reserves and accept others at points further North and that the Honourable, the Minister of Lands and Foreste would be disposed to favour the exchange and to inform you that inquiry will be made regarding the proposed exchange.
