## 1. Dowager Marchionesses

A dowager marchioness is so called when she is the widow of the preceding marquess, although it is more usual in these days to distinguish her from the reigning marquess's wife by using her christian name before her title. Either of the following examples is therefore correct:

The Social Manner

(used by friends)

Address of envelope 
(a) The Dowager Marchioness of A,

(b) Ishbel, Marchioness of A.

The Formal Manner

(used by inferiors, or

on ceremonial occasions)

Address of envelope

(a) The Most Honble. the Dowager Marchioness of A.

(b) The Most Honble Ishbel, Marchioness of A.
