Ottawa, 5th March, 1918.

Sir,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 27th ultimo, regarding the case of Manis Myrick, who desires to start farming on the Oak River Reserve; and in reply I beg to say that it has been decided to grant outfit him with a team of horses, a set of harness and with seed, as recommended, the approximate cost for which outfit should not exceed \$600.00. The assistance is given in this case on the ground that Myrick is an ex-pupil of the Elkhorn School and also a returned soldier, honourably discharged.

Myrick should sign an agreement, in duplicate, one copy of which should be forwarded to the Department, to the effect that he will refund to the Department, within two years time, the cost of the outfit over and above \$125.00 the usual ex-pupil grant.

A certificate from a veterinary surgeon, as to the soundness of the horses should be attached to the voucher covering the cost of the animals.
