Attached are the proceedings of
the Court for approval and safe custody.With reference to the delay in
forwarding the application the O.C., No. 6 District
Depot reports as follows:

"Gnr. L. H. Hunter, surrendered to the Reg'tl Police at No. 6 District Depot, C. A., at 2000 hrs., 13th February 1944. He was released to open arrest and was remanded to his own O.C. (107th Coast Battery, RCA) in close arrest at 1030 hrs., 15th Feb 44. We were advised by D. H.Q.'s letter H.110-66-18 (PRO) dated 22n Feb 44 to take the m/n soldier on strength and discipline at this Depot. We wired O.C., 107th Coast Bty., R.C. A., on 23rd Feb 44 asking that documentary evidence be sent Airmail on the 16th Feb 44, be returned. This evidence was received at this Depot on the 3rd March 1944. He was remanded for Summary of evidence on the 4th Mar 44. Documents were received 3rd Mar 44. He was remanded for D.C.M. on the 6th March 1944 and the Application was forwarded to D.H.Q. on that date."
