DEFENCE: 2nd Witness: L.6003 B.E.M. Achtzner, P.J., 1 Cdn. A/TK.  
Regiment, R.C.A., sworn states:

Cross examined by Defending Officer:

- Q.1 On the afternoon of 3 Feb 1944 were you speaking to Gnr.  
Bryson and Fairbairn?  
A.1 Yes.  
Q.2 At what time?  
A.2 About 1630 hours.  
Q.3 Were they under the influence of liquor?  
A.3 No, but they had been drinking, that is why I spoke to  
them.

Cross examined by Prosecutor:

- Q.1 Did you see them after supper?  
A.1 Yes.  
Q.2 What was their condition then?  
A.2 They seemed alright, but they had been drinking.  
Q.3 Did Gnr. Bryson have a bottle with him?  
A.3 It was ~~xxx~~ too dark to be sure, but I think he did.  
Q.4 Having seen them twice, and knowing that they had been  
drinking, did you order them to stop and return to their  
billets?  
A.4 I asked them to be careful and they were on their way to  
their billets then. It was 1830 hours.  
Q.5 Whose billets were they going to?  
A.5 Gnr. Bryson's.
