AN INTERESTING SUIT AGAINST THE EQUITABLE IN ENGLAND.—An interesting case brought against the Equitable Life on a fifteen-year semi-tontine policy is reported in the London papers. The application was made to the company's superintendent in London, and before signing the policy the insured inquired of him the minimum amount which he would receive above its face, and at his request the superintendent wrote down on a sheet of Equitable note paper as follows: "Results paid in fifteen years, cash value £7,390." This note was pinned to the policy, and when a subsequent loan was secured the policy, with the note attached, went to the head office, where it was assumed to have passed under the eyes of the officials.
