**THOMAS B. SOLMES' HOLSTEIN SALE.**  
The Holstein cattle offered for sale by Mr. Solmes, on Dec. 7th, are worthy of more than passing interest, because of the excellent strains from which they are bred, and because of their relationship to several of the Holstein champion cows of Canada.

The stock bull, "Sir Keyes Bell Decker," was sired by Sir Innes Darkroom Keyes, who is also the sire of Lulu Keyes, the 3-year-old heifer sold by Mr. E. B. Matley for \$1,500 at the Belleville sale in 1912. She was then the 3-year-old champion of Canada. Since that time she has made 36.6 lbs. butter in 7 days from 75 lbs. milk an average of 16.5 lbs. of butter and 11.2 lbs. of milk per day, in a thirty-day test she kept up her 16 lbs. of butter per day and averaged 16.8 lbs. milk per day. Her full sister, Leah Darkroom, has made 36.6 lbs. butter and 10.8 lbs. of milk, in 7 days from 75 lbs. milk, but her 3-year-old heifer, an average of 4.8 lbs. butter and almost 20 lbs. of milk per day. For 28 days she has 134.6 lbs. butter and 267.5 milk, an average of over 4 lbs. butter and over 10 lbs. milk per day. Another daughter, Trenton Keyes, has 27.1 lbs. butter with 47.6 lbs. milk in 7 days, still another one is May Keyes, who has 23.1 lbs. butter and 65.5 lbs. milk in 7 days. We find 10 daughters with records above the average for 7 days in 7 days. We also find her several daughters in yearly work with over 10,000 lbs. milk and 190 lbs. of butter in the year. From the above it can readily be seen that Mr. Solmes has the best blood possible on the sire's side of the bull that his young stock is from. "Sir Keyes Bell Decker." The name of his dam is Rosa Bell B., and in the Holstein Friesian Record book we find many Rosa records. Rosa Bell B. herself has a yearly record, milked twice per day, of 11,874 lbs. milk and 497.9 lbs. butter made the first year that yearly record work was started in Canada. We also find that Rosa Bell B. is a full sister to Rosa May, and Rosa May is the dam of May Keyes, the Canadian yearly record champion from 1910 to 1915, with 27,077 lbs. milk and 1,043 lbs. butter in seven days. We also find Rosa Bell B. to be the dam of the sire of Daisy Pastine Plester, who made in 1915 the yearly record of 30,877 lbs. milk and 1,827 lbs. of butter. Rosa Bell B. has also plenty of many other winners and many other close relatives in the Holstein Friesian Record book, among them are two champion cows of Canada.

Among the older females for sale is the famous Holstein Friesian, bred by A. D. Foster, of Bloomfield. She is sired by Dutchland Sir Hengerveld Majorcroft, who has 13 official record daughters and her dam is Helen Echo Decker, who has a record of 18.18 lbs. butter and 47.2 lbs. milk in 7 days, and she was sired by Count Echo Decker, the sire of May Echo and 13 others of the best record daughters bred in this district.

Rosa Darkroom has a record of 23.56 lbs. butter and 4.95 lbs. milk in 7 days. Her breeding is finer than her name would indicate. Her dam being Murray Bell, a daughter of Count Echo Decker, and her sire being Hilltop Belle Sir Jacob, who has several daughters with records over 20 lbs. butter in 7 days.

Delby Gerben Verbeke is sired by Count Gerben, sired by Count Gerben with 18 per cent. the same blood as 23 lbs. milk in 7 days, and who has 4 daughters whose average record is higher than an average of over 800 lbs. milk and 30 lbs. of butter in 7 days.

Budal Sylvia Pouch is sired by Inha Sylvia Decker Decker with 23 lbs. milk in 7 days, and who has 4 daughters with records over 20 lbs. milk in 7 days, and 4,196.5 in 30 days and 40 lbs. of butter in 7 days.

Budal Rosa Babu, a good young cow, is sired by Rosa Babu, who has a record of 17 lbs. of milk in 7 days for sale are from "Sir Keyes Bell Decker," and the above mentioned dams, and comment on their own prices and the fact that they are bred to that has brought several championships to his district. They will be a source of pleasure and profit to their new owners.

**PRINCE CO., P.E.I.**  
KENSINGTON, Nov. 13.—The frost on night of the 11th of November was the first we have had since the 1st of October. This year has been a good year for the farmer. Potatoes are 90c, Oats 50c. There is at present a stop to buying, as the boats are unable to carry the produce fast enough, and this has kept the price down, for we ought to be getting 15c a bushel more for potatoes. A good many have not established their young stock yet. There are more young cattle in this market than usual. Horses are very plentiful, and no demand for them. Lambs are selling at 8c; sheep, 6c; eggs, 5c, and butter, 35c-7c.

**RICHMOND CO., QUE.**  
DANVILLE, Nov. 14.—Unfavorable weather has delayed all farm work, and very little plowing is done. Root crops were good with the exception of potato, which are scarce and high in price. The ground is still with snow, but there is not enough for blighting. Cattle Manitoba are selling at 10c. Beef and pork are all in for the winter. Beef is quoted prices are still high. Steer is quoted at 44c; sheep, 40c—M. D. B.

**KINGS CO., P. E. I.**  
MONTAGUE, Nov. 14.—The past week we have had very little winter weather with a record of snow for sleighing and hard frosts. A great many records did not set. Their turnip all in. Shipments of potatoes from Prince Edward were very poor with no rot to speak of. Turnips were only a fair crop; other vegetables good with no rot to speak of. Turnips 10c; carrots, 10c; a bush, 10c; peas, 40c; butter, 35c; (highest price ever known); eggs, 32c; pork, 10c; 15c; oats, 55c—G. A. A.
