That his position was well adapted to his natural capacity and love for old books is evinced by his biographical articles in the folio "BIOGRAPHICA BRITANNICA, the British Librarian," The set comprises some SIX OR SEVEN HUNDRED of the MOST RARE AND VALUABLE HISTORICAL, POLITICAL, BIOGRAPHICA, AND ANTIQUARIAN TRACTS AND PAMPHLETS IN EXISTENCE, including a Question of the Cock, and whether his Crow affrights the Lion? The Expedition of his Highness the Prince of Orange for England. A discourse concerning the Spanish fleet invading England in the year 1588. The wars and causes of them between England and France, Proposals for carrying on an effectual war in America against the French and Spaniards, the Natural History of Coffee. Thee, Chocolate and Tobacco, Love-Letters from King Henry the Eighth to Anne Boleyn, some observations on the Use and Origin of the Noble Art and Mystery of Printing, an Epistle of the most mighty redouted Prince H nry the VIII, a Packe of Spanish Lyes, etc., Proceedings and Success of the English Army in the West Indies, a description of the sect called the Family of Love, with their common place of residence, a rod for the Lawyers, Killing no Murder, some Reasons for an annual Parliament. The above are only a sample of this interesting and scarce old lot.

Rowland Hill, after Viscount Hawkestone, who served in the Peninsular War, and took part in the Battle of Waterloo, and who was second in command of the Army of Occupation in France.
