ORDERED, that Mr. Papineau, the Attorney-General, Messieurs N. Coffin, Perinault, and Lees do compose the said Committee.

On motion of Mr. Planté, seconded by Mr. Berthelot,

ORDERED, that His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor's Answer to the Address of this House, voted the fifteenth of the month of March last, respecting the Rights and Pretentions which this Province may have upon the College of Quebec, and the Estates thereunto annexed, be taken into consideration on Monday next.
