The Petition of Jonathan Tremain, jun. was read, and considered; and thereupon Resolved, That it is the Opinion of this Committee, that the Sum of £8, 12. 5, should be granted and paid to the Petitioner, in sull for the Principal and Interest due on the three Treasurer's Notes in his Possession, agreeable to the Prayer of his Petition.

The Petition of Aiexander Cocken, and the Petition of Richard Hill, Isaac Bonnell, Isaac Hatsield and others, were by leave of the Committee, severally withdrawn.

The Petition of Amelia Elizabeth Jennison, was read and confidered, and there-upon,

Resolved, That it is the Opinion of this Committee, the said Petition should be dismissed.

The above Report, being again read, Mr. Tonge, thereupon moved, that the House do not agree to the same, so far as it relates to the dismissing of the Petition of Amelia Elizabeth Jennison, which being seconded and put, and the House dividing thereon, there appeared for the Motion Eight, against it Fourteen.

On Motion of Mr. Millidge, refolved, That a Committee be appointed to wait on his Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, to request he will be pleased to inform this House, what has been done, respecting the Prosecutions requested by this House, in their last Sessions, to be instituted against all Persons, who have been guilty of any Breaches of the Revenue Laws.

Ordered, That Mr. Millidge, Mr. Tonge, and Mr. Sterns, be a Committee for the above Purpose.

Mr. Sterns pursuant to leave given, presented a Bill, to amend, and render more effectual, an Act, passed in the 18th Year of his Majesty's Reign, intitled an Act, to prevent
