SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST LAND REGULATIONS.

THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and Duties—Six months' residence upon and ultivation of the land in each of three ears. A homesteader may live within the miles of his homestead on a farm of the control of the second of the second of the land of the second of the land.

at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price

section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months' residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Premption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased long-A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and creet a house worth \$300.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

BRITISH BOMBARD GERMAN BATTERIES ON GERMAN COAST

French Guns Assist in Attack on Enemy Defences as Far as Westende.

London, Sept. 8-The British fleet, after weeks of comparative inactivity along that coast, yesterday heavily bombarded the German batteries along the Belgian shore as far as Westende. Tons of metal were hurled upon

the German gun positions along the dunes in an effort to clear this litteral of dangerous opposition, in preparation it is believed here for an advance from Nieuport on the German right
