SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST LAND REGULATIONS.

THIS sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions. Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within five miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Six months' residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$200. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. W. W. BRITISH BOMBARD GERMAN BATTERIES ON GERMAN COAST

French Guns Assist in Attack on Enemy Defences as Far as Westende.

London, Sept. 8.—The British fleet, after weeks of comparative inactivity along that coast, yesterday heavily bombarded the German batteries west of the Belgian shore as far as Westende.
Tons of metal were hurled upon the German gun positions along the dunes in an effort to clear this litter of dangerous opposition, in preparation it is believed here for an advance from Nieuport on the German right wing.
French batteries stationed at Nieuport joined in the bombardment and the sky was alive with air machines, directing the fire of the gunners on sea and land.

PART OF MOVEMENT.

The attack upon the German positions along the coast is regarded as closely connected with the great artillery activity that has been in evidence for more than two weeks now along the western front. Yesterday the artillery fighting was particularly pronounced in the sectors north and south of Arras to do serious damage to the German works.

North and south of Ypres there was also violent cannonading, the British batteries contributing their share to the great bombardment that is in progress along the whole line. The British have been adding many guns on their front at late, according to unofficial reports, and are believed to have repaired the shortage of munitions, which hindered their operations for so long.

The German official report yesterday claimed the repulse of French attempts at several points, the capture of a number of Belgians during mining operations along the Yser and the bringing down of a hostile aviator by German battle machines in the Vosges.
