Bulgars Ask Compensation

****************** ABLE despatches from correspondents with the Allied armies now in Bulgaria indicate that the Bulgars have A 28 not as yet decided to amend their FOR SALE-Fifty acres for the attitude toward established facts, and to cease putting forward their usual ridiculous pretensions regarding Macedonia and Thrace.

It is apparent from the despatches sent by correspondents that these pretensions have taken a new formthe form of "compensation." This is an improvement on the past. A few years ago these same pretensions took the form of extermination. Unable to muster sufficient nationals in Macedonia and still less in Thrace. the Bulgars endeavored to exterminresolutely refused to abandon their own national traditions and religion. And so, now, the old pretensions

are clothed with the new specious cloak of "compensation." "Let Serbia," the Bulgars say, "expand toward the north and the Adriatic, let Greece take the islands and some part of Asia Minor and let Bulgaria have the Macedonia which she covets." In another paragraph we read that besides Macedonia, they are convinced that both the Dobroudja and Cavalla will be assigned to them. Apparently, then, they are unable to understand the fact that if Serbia "expands to the north and the justification holds good, seeing that is Shakespeare.—Buffalo News. the Dodecanese Islands, now under the military occupation of Italy, to which they refer, contain entirely Greek populations, and the district of Smyrna, in Asia Minor, for instance, contains no fewer than 245,-000 Greek inhabitants.

Dobroudja, which the Bulgars claim holes at proper distances, and comand which was recently wrested from municating with a common air cham-Roumania by the abominable treaty ber beneath. The notes are produced imposed on the latter by the Germans by stopping the holes with the fingers. and Bulgars, is inhabited by Roumanians. As regards Macedonia and Cavalla, I can again quote exact figures. In the district of Cavalla, for 3,904 foreign inhabitants and Slavophones, the latter being by no means always pure Bulgars. In the district of Serres (Serres, Zichni, etc.) there were on the same date 66,098 orthodox Greeks and 12,260 Slavophones. phones. Why on earth, then, should Bulgaria expand in territories inhabited by races that are anything except Bulgarian?

It cannot be claimed that the figures quoted above as orthodox self to be deluded on this subject. Greeks include Bulgars, for the simple reason that in that part of the world the abrupt barrier of religion element. The latter, being under the in religion, and naturally Greek in tradition and national consciousness, will be found in the Greek churches where divine service has been held in the Greek language from the day when Saint Paul landed at Salonica. The Bulgars being schismatic in religion, i.e., under the jurisdiction of the Bulgarian Exarch, do not attend the Greek orthodox churches. The dividing line is, therefore, clearly and distinctly drawn. Nothing that the Bulgars have said or will say can alter established facts and no method, whether old or new, whe-ther in the form of extermination or compensation, can justify their claims to territories in which they are aliens from every point of view.
