CRIMINAL CASES. Very Old Man Acquitted of Charge of Theft. This morning Judge Snider let George Morton, a man of 80 years, go, after hearing the evidence in a charge of theft against him. The story told was rather conflicting. He was charged with having stolen from Mrs. Jennie Edworthy the sum of \$100 during the past two years. He made a bargain with Mrs. Edworthy, after her husband had died, to sell the effects of the latter's foundry, on Ferguson avenue. Mrs. Edworthy claimed that Morton had sold all the tools in the place, but that she had received no money. It was understood that Morton was to have 10 per cent on the sale. Morton made one sale, as far as Mrs. Edworthy was aware, an engine to Goldberg, the second hand man, for \$40. Witness said that Morton came to her and asked her to sign a paper, which stated that Goldberg had received the engine. Harvey Hill stated that he had made an inventory of the stock that was in the place at the time of Mr. Edworthy's death, at the request of Mrs. Edworthy. The accused, Mr. Morton, went into the stand and denied that he had sold anything for Mrs. Edworthy, with the exception of the engine, for which he said that he got no money. Morton said that anyone had a chance to enter the foundry and steal anything that happened to be at hand, as the windows of the place were not locked. Judge Snider, in acquitting Morton, said that he had a grave fear that Morton was not telling the truth of the matter. However, the evidence was such that he could not be convicted. William Toland, of Jerseyville, who was charged some time ago with threatening Egbert McPherson, of that same town, was bound over to keep the peace in the sum of \$50. George Fisher, city, charged with the same offence against Fred Raven, was discharged after a lecture by the Judge. He was up in default of sureties.
