Shows Molecular Attraction.

An interesting exhibition demonstrating molecular attraction exerted between bodies in contact was given last Monday at the Paris Academie des Sciences by the Swedish engineer, Johansson, who is the inventor of a process by which steel plates are ground and polished to a degree of smoothness hitherto impossible to attain.

The slightest unevenness, even if invisible to the naked eye, suffices to prevent molecular adhesion. Two pieces of steel, shown to be free from cletromagnetic influences, were placed one on top of the other with the result that they could not be separated again, even when heavy weights were used in attempts to pull them apart, it was scientifically shown that the space between the two plates did not amount to one 1-100,000 millimeter.
