The Land Court opened to-day before a large attendance. Lord Justice O'Hagan said the Court had decided on extremely simple rules of procedure. The fee for entering the Court would be only a shilling, so that nobody could have an excuse of not having the advantage of the Land Act. There will be a similar fee on giving notice of appeal. Many tenants, he said, had already applied to have rents fixed, but no decision could be given before ten days. The Commissioners would do their best to The Commissioners would do their best to make the Act a success. The Judge's statement was received with applause.

LONDON, Oct. 20.—Mr. Cowan, M. P., calls to mind that it has been declared in the House of Commons the Land League cannot be suppressed without an act of Parliament.

Two hundred tenants of a large estate near Nenagh, County of Tipperary, paid their rents to-day. The police tear down the "no rent" notices wherever posted.

Dublin, Oct. 20—Archbishop Croke says: "I read the manifesto with the utmost pain; indeed with absolute dismay. Against the committal of the people of Ireland, even under still more exciting circumstances to such a dectrine, I enter my solemn protest. I have been a steadfast, uncompromising supporter of the League's public policy, believing it constitutional, calculated to effect great national results, but I always, unequivocally, stated that I stand out for fair rents as the safe foothold of the agriculturalists of the soil; the hold of the agriculturalists of the soil; the absolute repudiation of rent would meet no Right Rev. John Hughes,

absolute repudiation of rent would meet no sympathy from me. There is no more reason now for abandoning the original platform of the League than there was when Davitt was sent to Portland and Dillon was first imprisoned. Its original policy was righteous and tested by experience. The results welded the clergy and laymen in one loving brotherhood. I believe the new policy can lead to nothing but disintegration and defeat." Dublin, Oct. 20.—The proclamation against the Land League warns all persons that the Irish National Land League, or by what other name it may be called, is an unlawful and criminal association, and all meetings to carry out or promote its designs or purposes is unlawful and criminal and will be prevented and dispersed by force. The proclamation warns the Queen's subjects connected with the League to disconnect themselves from it and abstain from giving further countenance to it. All the powers and resources at the Government's command will be employed to protect the Queen's subjects in the free exercise of their lawful callings and occupations, to enforce the fulfillment of all lawful obligations and save the process of the law and the execution of the Queen's writs from hindrance or obstruction. It calls upon all loyal subjects to nphold and maintain the authority of the law and the supremacy of the Queen in Ireland.

One hundred thousand copies of United Ireland have been distributed throughout Ireland, representing the Government and Premier as practising every form of brutality.
