ROOSEVELT JR. TO DEVOTE SELF TO PUBLIC LIFE

Announces He Intends to Follow Footsteps of his Father and Enter Politics.

New York, April 13.—Lieut. Col. Theodore Roosevelt, who has been discussed by Republican party leaders in this city as a possible candidate for president of the board of aidmen next fall, announced yesterday that he intended to follow the footsteps of his father and enter politics. He declined to state, however, whether the aldermanic berth would prove acceptable to him, in as he received a formal invitation to run for that office, asserting that it was too soon for him to pick his initial goal. He added that he was announcing his "hat was in the ring" only because he intended to retire from business and considered some explanation necessary. His present activities, he said, were confined to organization in this country of the World War Veterans' Association. In making known his intention to retire from business, Lieut. Col. Roosevelt said that he desired to devote himself to "public life," by which he said he meant "entering politics."

LIVES ARE LOST IN HULL FIRE

Early Morning Disaster Results in Death of Three Girls and Destruction of Valuable Property

(Special To The Journal.)

Ottawa, April 3.—Three lives were lost and property damage estimated at between thirty-five thousand and forty thousand dollars was caused by an early morning fire at Hull which gutted what is known as the Dorion Block, on the corner of Main and Leduc streets, consisting of a social club and three stores, in the heart of the business section of the city.

The dead are Misses Marie Dorion, aged 40, Gracie aged 32, and Blanche aged 10. The two former are daughters and the latter the grand-daughter of Mrs. L. N. Dorion, part owner of the burned block. The girls lived alone in the top flat of the building, and it is surmised were overcome by dense smoke which suffocated them, as the bodies when recovered were not touched by flames. Although the firemen knew the girls were in the building and made no valiant attempts to rescue them, they

were unable to enter the apartment while they were known to be, owing to the intensity of the fire.

NEW PROBE OPENS AT OSGOODE HALL

The first sitting of the Royal Commission appointed by the Government to investigate the charges made by H. H. Dewar K.C., M.P.P., will be held at Osgoode Hall at 11 o'clock tomorrow. Full power has been given Sir William Meredith, Chief Justice of Ontario, to inquire into all charges contained in Hartley Dewar's speech of March 20, and into all the suggestions made in articles of the Toronto World relative to the Homer case from February 21 to February 28.
