The Committee on Privileges and Elections yesterday declared Dr. Robertson to have been ineligible at the time of nomination to be a candidate for the House of Commons.

A despatch from Winnipeg says: Judging by the opening of immigration this season, it is probable that 25,000 men will be sent to the west.

The minimum estimate is put at 100,000. This year a great bulk of farmers are passing west to settle on land.

Great numbers are pouring in from the east to subdivide land into territories for settlers.

Great as the number is, it is yet too small to keep pace with the immigration.

Newfoundland Seal Fishery.

We are pleased to learn by exchanges, of the 2nd inst., that the seal fishery promises to be most successful.

Only three of the fleet had been out on the 2nd inst., but reports received are of a very cheering character.

On Monday, the 2nd inst., the men for ten days previously having slept when they could, upon the boats on deck, in the cool bunkers, or packed in the fore-cabin, were herring in a barrel. They were only too glad to find room for themselves.

On Monday, the 2nd inst., the vessel arrived at the fleet, the Capt. Joseph Barber, made his appearance, with 24,000 harp seals, and 2000 hogs, weighing close to 600 tons.

These steaming reports that the seal fishery is so successful, in all respects, is very gratifying; but none of the heavy Arctic drift, the "hummus," was met with. The same day the steamer "Hud" arrived with 20,000 seals, nearly all harp, of the first class.

The steamer "Commodore" arrived at Harbor Grace on the morning of the 2nd inst., with 20,000 seals, but a large proportion of them are herring. The following vessels are reported: "Bear," 25,000; "Nyctus," 17,000; "Vanguard," 15,000; "Narcissus," 12,000; "Hesperus," 10,000.

Other vessels are reported to have made good catches. The seal fishery will cheer many homes in Newfoundland, and will be learned with pleasure, we are sure, by the people of our own Province, who have long enjoyed so intimate and profitable business relations with it.

By despatches since received, we learn that the Dunlop steamer "Resolute" and "Thetis" have arrived. The former is carrying 30,000 young seals, and the latter 20,000 seal pups. The apprehension regarding the safety of the steamer "Hud," supposed to have left the ice fields for home on the 2nd inst., and up to the 6th had not been reported. She was very deeply loaded, and carried 35,000 seals.

To give the Executive Government power to decide finally in disputed cases is most arbitrary. It is not right to invest the Board of Education with any such power. Public opinion has not demanded this change, nor, indeed, any of the changes contemplated by the measure. Instead of lessening the duties of the Inspectors, another Inspector should be appointed. One inspection in a year will not amount to anything. And what guarantee have we that the inspectors will perform their duties more thoroughly? Or why should they be made permanent officers?

Mr. CAMPBELL argued that the Board of Education would not probably be biased with respect to cases such as they would be called upon to decide, and strongly supported the amendments proposed.

Mr. GORDON also supported the amendments, and considered that the money expended in giving our young men and women a good education, enabling them to take creditably high positions at home and abroad, is money well expended.

Mr. BLAKE said he could not see the force of the objection raised against the Bill by the Opposition. He discussed the amendments at some length.

Mr. McLELLAN opposed the measure, and advocated abolition of the supplementary clause.

Motion carried. The Bill was read a second time.

The Budget.

The Budget Speech of Sir Leonard Tilley will have a different effect upon the minds of the Conservatives and the Liberals, or at least, as regards the latter, upon their leader, for we cannot bring ourselves to believe the vast majority of the people of this country, no matter how much they may be otherwise than rejoiced at finding Canada still in the full swing of prosperity. There is a large surplus, in the first place, which is, in itself, satisfactory. There are circumstances under which we can surmise a surplus to be a mixed blessing, when, for instance, the people grow under a load of taxation, for in that case it would be like having a balance at your bankers while you are besieged by legitimate creditors. The parallel does not apply, however, in connection with Sir Leonard Tilley's surplus
