United America on 1924 Olympic.

America at last stands united in athletic and should sweep the trophies at the Olympic games in Paris in 1924.

The declaration of peace between the National Amateur Athletic Federation and the Amateur Athletic Union, by which both warring bodies agree to recognize the rights and powers of the other, and the agreement by which every athletic organization in the United States shall have a voice in Olympic matters, means that, for the first time, the United States will be able to send a truly representative squad of athletes to the Olympics.

The compromise effected in Washington, which the American Olympic Association met to select the American Olympic committee was more far-reaching in effect than the general sporting public imagined.

By this compromise the United States Army, Navy and National Collegiate Association and the Federation, with its forty constituent organizations, agreed to join the Amateur Athletic Union in getting a really American Olympic committee.

Fighting for Equal Vote.

The Army, Navy, Collegiate Association and the Federation have been fighting for months to secure a vote equal to that of the A.A.U. in Olympic matters. The fight was against the absolute control of Olympic affairs by the Amateur Athletic Union—or rather by its leaders. The Army, Navy, the colleges, the remount division, which supply the bulk of competitors in Olympics meets, threatened to withdraw from any participation in the next Olympics if control was vested in the minority which controls the A.A.U.

Fortunately the cooler leaders on both sides saw a way of reaching an agreement and the A.A.U. leaders compromised by giving other athletic organizations proper representation.

The committee of fifty which is being chosen to handle American Olympics will represent about forty organizations. The A.A.U. recognized as controlling track and field, boxing, swimming, wrestling in the amateur field, will, of course, be the leading element, but the Olympic committee, instead of being in control of the A.A.U., will be representative.

The organization of the Olympic association and the granting of equal representation to other organizations follows Secretary of War Weeks' urgent recommendations and insures future Olympic committees composed of representatives of all athletic interests in the United States.

Start Getting Ready.

The work of getting ready for the Olympic games of 1924 will commence at once. The choosing of additional members of the committee to raise funds for the transportation and entertainment of the American representatives already has started. The committee will commence next summer to arrange for competitive meets in which the American athletes will be chosen.

There is certain to be a big argument over the choosing of the trainer to head the next Olympic team, especially the track and field team which causes the most trouble in the last Olympic meet.

The including of the Remount division insures America strong representation in the riding events, where it has been weak and the joining forces with the U. S. Lawn Tennis association gives the United States certain points in competition which it has lacked before. The granting of representation to the Gymnastic association, which includes all the Turner societies, means that the United States will be strongly represented in a branch where the Europeans have been piling up points. In addition the women will be better represented than ever before.

America's chances of victory are much enhanced by the declaration of peace between the athletic bodies.

Offer 300,000 Francs For Return Bout.

PARIS, Dec. 13th.—(United Press)—Announcing its desire to terminate the Carpenter-Siki controversy arising from the boxer's victory that gave him the light-heavyweight championship, a small bicycle firm has offered 300,000 francs for a match between the two men within ten weeks. The boxers may divide the purse as they choose, or fight winner take all. Siki has been barred from boxing in France by the commission in charge of the sport, because of his actions following his unexpected victory over Carpenter.

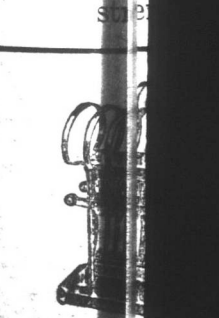
