NEW YORK, April 3.—Earnings of Gulf States Steel Company for quarter of 1925 will be substantially in excess of either first or second quarter of 1924.

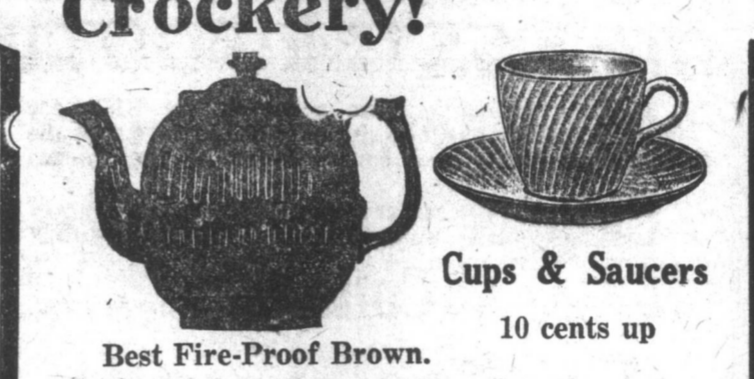
