A Knowledge of Eugenics Will Prevent Falling in Love With Wrong Man.

London, March 22. - The authorities of the Bedford College for Women invited the Eugenics Education Society to send them a lecturer, and a few days ago a bevy of girl students laughed and blushed while Professor nge talked to them of eugenics. A knowledge of eugenics, he said, would tend to prevent girls from fallng in love with the wrong men. It was frequently objected that the science constituted an undue interference with an individual's free choice

in falling in love and marrying. "To a certain extent," said the professor, "I sympathize with that objection, but I do think a certificate of sound health should be one of the things insisted upon before marriage. Unconsciously, as things are now, we are much guided by eugenic considerations.
