German Headquarters Hit. The report of the actual fighting is repetition or what has appeared in the daily French official statements, telling of the capture of German renches, of sapping and mining operations, and heavy artillery duels. Con-cerning the latter, the observer says that the British artillery on December 17 obtained several hits on what appeared to be the German headquarters.

"From a prisoner captured on De-cember 14 it has been ascertained that oth the Twenty-Taird Regiment and the Jaegers suffered enormous losses on November 4. The same man described the fifth of November as a terrible day, saying that he had never before seen uch mud as that in which the Germans were operating and that the troops were suffering very much from the presence of water in the trenches. The shelling which he went through on the 14th of this month exceeded anything, which he had experienced previously,


