## NEW CANDIDATE FLIES 'DRY' FLAG

Outcome of Whitechapel "By" Will Be Interesting.

LONDON, Jan. 31.—(Canadian Press Cable).—What politics does the Jew in England espouse at the present time?

The answer, it is believed, will be revealed in the Whitechapel by-election, the campaign for which is now in full swing.

Whitechapel has a large Jewish population. Papers are printed in Yiddish and the Church of England conducts services for Jewish followers. The whole Jewish community is peaceful and law-abiding, and it is the Gentile population which gives the police to most trouble.

Here England's first prohibitionist candidate seeks the way to Westminster. Possibly the world-wide reputation for sobriety possessed by the Jewish race caused Samuel Holden to fly the "dry flag" here, although he does not admit it. So far he is without the support of Edwin Scrymgeour, the prohibitionist who defeated Winston Churchill in Dundee, but he expects his assistance later in the campaign. Indeed, he is without any prominent supporters, but the man who goes around with him and makes speeches, outside saloons, doors and interpreters them into Yiddish for the benefit of the Jews. Probably this is superfluous for Jewish in Whitechapel, though preferring to read and write in its own language, also understands English perfectly.

## SCORN 'DRY' CANDIDATE.

Despite the unpopularity of treating any opponent lightly the candidature of a prohibitionist is regarded by D. J. Kiley, the Asquith-Grey Liberal candidate, who lost his seat in Whitechapel to the late C. J. Mathew, K. C., the noted labor lawyer. In the general election of November last, and by Harry Gosling, president of the Transport Workers' Federation, the Labor candidate in the present contest, with scarcely disguised contempt. Whitechapel has two of the biggest breweries in England and they provide work for several hundred men, and incidentally give handsome subscriptions to church efforts.

Mr. Kiley knows Whitechapel thoroughly and believes he has many of the leading Jews with him. He also counts upon the support of the Whitechapel street traders, whom he assisted in the last Parliament in resisting police regulations which were considered unjust and irksome.

Harry Gosling also knows the district intimately. The late member, Mr. Mathew, was a Catholic, and Mr. Gosling holds the view that he will succeed to the Catholic vote, which is not by any means negligible.

Jewish official Socialists are supporting him.

## CLEAR WAY TO INNER DOOR OF PHARAOH TOMB

LUXOR, Egypt, Jan. 31.—The last of the treasures of Pharaoh Tutankhamen were being removed to-day from the outer chamber of his tomb in the Valley of the Kings preparatory to opening the sealed inner room where the monarch of more than 3,000 years ago is believed to lie.

It is likely that several days will have elapsed before the excavators break through the walled doorway leading to the inner tomb, as all the contents of the outer chamber must first be removed. They are very fragile and can be handled only by experts. Therefore the work of removing them is proceeding slowly.

## GRAFT HINDERS ALL CHINA

Leader Explains Why Ills and Evils Continue.

HONG KONG, Jan. 29.—Dr. Sherrin Eddy, the Y. M. C. A. leader, openly denounced "squeeze" in China at an address which he gave in this city to young Chinese. He asked why it was that the great natural wealth of China was left untapped, why were the people allowed to remain without education and why were so many evils permitted to continue? Simply because of one thing, said Dr. Eddy—"squeeze." Giving an example of what he had in mind, the speaker said in one province which he had visited, which was rich in coal deposits, \$149,000 was required for opening up the mines, but only \$40,000 was used for the purpose for which it was obtained, the balance finding its way into the pockets of various officials.

Dr. Eddy concluded by asserting that "No one can save China but her own people, her own leaders, and her own students."

Frank Solari and Alexander Ugolini, of Youngstown, O., recently started on an automobile tour which, it is said, will take four years to complete. Over a trail covering 125,000 miles on land and 12,000 miles on sea, they plan to cross the United States, then work down through Mexico and Central America to Buenos Aires, whence they will sail for Africa. ## REDS SAY AMERICANS HAVE GOLD CONCESSION

35-Year Grant in Siberia Rented for 11 Cent. of Output.

MOSCOW, Jan. 29.—Soviet newspapers are making much of an alleged new American venture in Russia, this time a 35-year concession to an American syndicate to work the gold mines of the Amur district in Siberia. Where Washington Vanderbilt, with his celebrated Russian concession, comes in is not stated.

The rental under the new concession is to be 18 per cent. of the annual gold production, and at the expiration of the lease the entire mining equipment used by the syndicate is to be turned over to the Soviet Government without compensation. Work is expected to begin early this year, and only awaits the confirmation of the concession by the Soviet Government.

The newspapers also announce the conclusion of arrangements with "American trusts" for the extension of commercial credits to the Soviet. These credits, it is said, are to be used in large part for the purchase of agricultural machinery and factory equipment.
