



Queen's First Loss In 27 Games Gives Ottawa Title

Senators Will Play Winnipeg Tiggers Next Saturday For Dominion Championship

OTTAWA, Nov. 29.—Thwarted at every turn in their offensive efforts and smashed back by a relentless attack that was at times almost savage in its ferocity, the great Queens rugby machine that for nearly four years has held sway on Canadian grids, in which time they ruled up an impressive record of 26 consecutive victories, faltered and finally crumpled here yesterday afternoon and the Ottawa Senators marched over the Red, Yellow and Blue to an impressive and decisive victory by a score of 11 to 2. In defeating the Queen's team the Ottawa Senators won the title of 1925 Eastern Canada titleholders. There is still one obstacle in their path on the way to Dominion honors and this will be encountered here next Saturday, when Winnipeg Tammans Tiggers, Western Canada champions, invade the capital in quest of the Canadian rugby crown. There was no doubt which was the superior team yesterday.

ACCLAIM SENATORS

The most ardent Queen's fans, football strategists and men who are authorities in the port were unanimous in declaring that the Senators outplayed the tri-color at every turn for the greater part of the 60 minutes. The two teams served up almost faultless football and the carelessness with which the players were executed made the game an exciting one from start to finish. The tale of the Dominion titleholders is told in the statistics, compiled on the line plays during the afternoon and in recounting the exploits of Capt. Joe Tubman and his highly educated foot. Not once during the entire game could the Queen's plungers force their way through the

local front rank for yards, while the Ottawa stalwarts rammed their way along for yards on five occasions, two of which were from first downs. Tubman booted 25 times against Leadley's 24 and while Leadley could only return one Ottawa punt all afternoon, six of his own offerings were hurled back at the Queens back field before the tacklers had thrown the Ottawa booters. After time Tubman booted into touch after propelling the oval up the famous and daring tri-color running halves were held in pockets by the outside wings from which they could not escape, and in the face of whom they were able to record only very slight gains when they did leave their tracks after making the catch. The burning question of whether or not the Ottawa outside wings were in a class with the tri-color flankers was answered emphatically when Starr and Young turned in kicking exhibitions that were a treat to see. In addition they held their covers to the king's fane.

WINTER WEATHER

The game was played under winter weather conditions. The thermometer must have been around the zero mark, while the playing area resembled an open-air rink. Horse-drawn scrapers were employed to take the snow off and there was a two-foot snow bank on each side of the field. The footing was hard as concrete, but did not appear to be slippery and the players were able to travel at their best with apparently no trouble.

Queens scored first. After their aerial attack had been successfully met for half the first period Leadley made the opening point possible. Tubman had kicked to Batstone, but the red-head snapped the pass away to Leadley for 50 yards before Miller nailed him. On the third down Leadley kicked to the deadline.

More than half the second period had passed when Ottawa opened their scoring. Leadley being thrown for a forced fumble on Tubman's kick, Ottawa 2, Queens 1. Tubman booted another point when he sent a bounding ball over the deadline from Queen's 50-yard line, making it Ottawa 2, Queens 2. Lynch added another point before the period ended, when his drop kick from the 25-yard mark went wide of the target, but to the deadline. Ottawa 4, Queens 1.

Queens could not improve their total with the wind in the third period until just before time was up, when Miller fumbled Leadley's kick and Walker recovered the oval on the Ottawa 40-yard line. Leadley promptly kicked and Lynch was held for a point. Ottawa 4, Queens 2.

GAME'S BIG BREAK

Tubman kicked to Batstone for a rouse shortly after the last period opened. Ottawa 5, Queens 2. Then came the big break in the game. Ottawa came into possession on the Queen's 25-yard line when Chantler's pass to Leadley was forward. Lynch tried another drop, but it went wide. Batstone grabbed the ball and started out, but Starr smashed him down and shook the ball loose with a terrific tackle. Jimmy Wright, substitute inside wing, dropped on the ball for a touchdown, which Connell failed to convert. Ottawa 10, Queens 2. St. Mikes Capture College Series

Qualify On Round Against McGill To Play In Sarnia On Wednesday

MONTREAL, Nov. 29.—After a lapse of 11 years St. Michael's College, of Toronto, again rules as head of the intercollegiate intermediate rugby group in Eastern Canada. The smart little squad trained by Rev. Father Carr went down to defeat in the second of the home-and-home games with McGill here on Saturday afternoon by 7 to 0, but won the round 18-11 and entered the semi-finals for the title to which C. N. R., Quebec champions, and Sarnia, Ontario Rugby Football Union have also qualified.

Football was impossible on the gridiron at the McGill stadium on Saturday, ankle-deep snow militating against any type of play except punting, and this being the game a few players managed to stagger through the lines for gains and at odd moments Lebel, of St. Mikes, and Curly Taylor, of McGill, opposing half backs, started the fans with some smart breaks in the open field. For the most part the players floundered in the snow and the officials were brain-fagged trying to figure out whether yards had been made or not on plunges. On the line Dave did some smart driving for St. Mikes and Adams for McGill. Both teams tried their best to open up the play and get a break, but practically every effort was wasted. The only point in the first half went to McGill on a kick to the deadline.

Throughout the greater part of the second half McGill was the aggressor and a smart return punt by Tommy Arnold netted McGill its second point. Still the pressure was maintained in the final quarter, with Curly Taylor starting for the local college fans. His smart play was rewarded in the final period, when he drove 10 feet to fall on a fumbled ball just over St. Mikes' goal line for the lone touchdown of the game.
