The Guide Wheels are the invention of Prosser, the Patentee, who projected t'an in order to improve the mode of guiding Carriages along the Rails, and to diminsh the friction and wear and tear of machinary, thus enabling him to construct cheap lines by the substitution of a less expensive material for Rails than iron.
