Whereupon, under the authority of the said Act of

Whereupon, under the authority of the said Act of the Parliament of Canada, it was by His kxcellency, by and with the advice of his Privy Council, Ordered, and it is hereby ordered, that ou, from, and after the first day of October next, all Copyright works being first composed or written and printed in the United Kingdom, and printed or reprinted in any other country, and with regard to which the notice to the Commissioners of Customs required by any Act of the Imperial Parliament in that behalf, shall have been given, and a list of which shall have been published by the proper authority in England; from time to time, as the list in the form established by law, shall lave been furnished the Customs Department for that purpose, by the Imperial authorities, may be entered for divy on payment of twelve pounds ten shillings upon every hundred pounds value thereof—and under and subject to the same regulations as dutiable goods are now, or may hereafter be, admitted to entry for payment of duty urder the authority of any law of this Dominion relating to Customs, Trade or Navigation.

That all sums collected as duty on such Copyright Works shall liess the cost of adverticing, postages and making up the accounts of the same, at the end of erry iscal year, say Eith June, be remitted to Her Hajesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies or such other Officer or party as may be from time to time appointed by competend mithority to receive the time of the Works which may be imported under these regulations.

Whereof the Honorable the Minister of Customs shall take due notice, and give the necessary directions for carrying the same interfect.

His Excellency in Council, on the recommendation of the Honorable the Minister o' Agriculture, and note the provisions of Agr22 Vio. Cap. 15, has been pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 8th day of October instant, the Order in Council of the 13th August last prohibiling the importation of Horned Cattle from the said United States of America into the Propinces of Quebec and Ontario, shall be, and the same is hereby revoked.

These Regulations shall remain in force until the First day of November next, and longer.
