And whereas, every attempt to procure adequate funds for

these purposes, has proved unsuccessful:

Therefore resolved, That, with the view of realising means for active Temperance efforts by lecturers, tracts and otherwise, this Grand Division do hold a Bazaar or Fair, (in connection with the Order.) in the city of Halifax, during the Annual Session, in October next.

Resolved, That a Committee of five members of this Grand Division be appointed to correspond with the Subordinate Divisions, and otherwise to carry the foregoing into effect.

On motion, it was Resolved, That during the Session the G. D. adjourn at 1 o'clock, P. M., meet at 3 P. M.,

and adjourn at 5 P. M.

On motion, it was Resolved, That a public temperance meeting be held this evening, at eight o'clock, at which the members of Grand and Subordinate Divisions will attend, wearing appropriate Regalia, and that a committee be appointed to make arrangements for the same.

Brothers H. B. Mitchell, James P. Milward, and D. Dimock were appointed a committee in accordance with the

foregoing resolution.

On motion, it was Resolved, That the Grand Division pay a visit to Chester Division, this evening, at half-past six o'clock.

Grand Division adjourned.
