Vancouver, B.C., July 26.

Robert Jatiray, president of Crow's Nest Coal Company, interviewed this morning, said he was we'l satisfied with the work going on. It was really development work but they had plenty of coal of exceptional quality and the coke evens were working full blast. Fifty evens were now in operation and sixty more would be completed as soon as a delayed shipment of tunnel heads arrived. This would give them a capacity of 118 tons of coke per day. Quite recently a new ten-foot coal seam had been struck and the capacity of the mine is daily increasing. The coal is of a bituminous nature of excellent quality, makes very little ash, about 4 per cent., and gives a fierce heat. The mine is already shipping to Winnipeg, and has shipped large quanti ies to Brandon, and the company will be able to turn out all that British Colum bia will require for some time to come.
