But few remarks additional appear to be necessary. I do not hesitate to say that the congregation ought to be self-supporting. One hundred families should surely raise on an average six dollars for salary. I find, however, it is with difficulty that they can manage to meet all demands this year, even while receiving \$200 from the Presbytery Home Mission. The reason they give is the common cry, "hard times." Very often when I hear men crying "hard times," I am disposed to say "..o sirs, the times are not so hard as your hearts," but in the present case I must honestly say that many of the people have not got and cannot get the money to give or they would give more. There are some mean people every where, but generally the congregation are willing to do all they can.

In looking at the number of families, it should be remembered that many have lately joined in with us, and that therefore some time will pass by before
