returns from a strike. Can we do it soon rather than having to wait around for the speech writer to come off strike?

The Acting Speaker (Mr. Paproski): I believe there is another question or comment. The hon, member for Yorkton-Melville.

Mr. Nystrom: I think you can tell from my speeches that I do not use speech writers, Mr. Speaker. We are not allowed to read speeches in the House, as you know. I respect the rules of the House. I could do like some government back-benchers, I guess, and get up and read a long monotonous speech, but I do not know who would write the speech. I do not know of any speech writers who are on strike now.

I am glad that the member for Calgary will accept a debate. Perhaps we can arrange that as soon as possible. the sooner the better. I am sure his constituents will be very glad to hear that. Let us head out to Calgary and find an independent organization to sponsor it and have a good debate.

The Acting Speaker (Mr. Paproski): Resuming debate with the hon. member for St. John's East.

Mr. Ross Reid (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Fisheries and Oceans): Mr. Speaker, like all Members of this House, I would love to spend the day having a debate on concurrence in the finance committee's report of last June. Frankly, Mr. Speaker, I would like nothing more than to see you in full flight, robes off, standing on the chair, as suggested by my hon. friend across the way.
