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NEW INSPECTOR IS APPOINTED

Arthur T. Rowell Gets Promotion in Ontario Provincial Police. Arthur T. Rowell of Englehart, has been appointed inspector of the northern division of the Ontario Provincial Police. His promotion from the rank and file to this executive position, follows the recent gazetted resignation of Inspector Geo. Colbeck, an sheriff of the newly created judicial district of Timiskaming. In announcing the new officer Rowell stated that he would be in charge of the bulk of affairs in the north, including the Porcupine mining region. Rowell who has served six years with the force, has become well-known through his instrumentality in enforcing the liquor license laws, and detecting ingenious methods resorted to. He has also rendered good service in connection with several violent crimes committed in New Ontario and the department expresses great confidence in his ability. His services commence at once and a new uniform has been forwarded. BORDEN'S PERMANENT POLICY. London Telegraph Says Announcement is Coming. LONDON, May 20. - (C. A. P.) - The Daily Telegraph (Unionist) today declares, without, however, citing what authority it has for its statement, that as soon as the naval bill reaches the senate, Premier Borden will consider himself in a position to elaborate Canada's permanent naval policy. "The Canadian premier is convinced that the voting of three dreadnoughts will not give adequate expression to Canada's desire to co-operate in the defence of imperial maritime interests," declares the Telegraph, which further states: "The Halifax dockyard will be developed and an entirely new base will be created on the Pacific, Vancouver being converted into a great imperial naval base."
