CANADIAN MINING FUSION IS PENDING

Northern Ontario Exploration Company Being Absorbed by California Co.

LONDON, Dec. 22.—(C.A.P.)—A Canadian mining fusion is in progress, according to today's Times, which states that a meeting of the shareholders of the Northern Ontario Exploration Company has been called for today week to consider a proposal for absorption of the company by the California Exploration Company, in which it has a large interest.

The California company, it is explained, has for the past two years been operating up the Plymouth Consolida mine in California. The terms upon which the absorption is to take place are briefly:

It is proposed that shares in the California Exploration Company should be split into shares of 10 shillings each and the capital increased to \$120,000, the Northern Ontario Exploration Company receiving 156,117 shares for its assets exclusive of its existing holdings in the California Exploration Company. The latter will represent 22,960 shares; this will give for distribution to the shareholders of the Northern Ontario Exploration Company 179,157 shares in the California Exploration Company. In other words, three shares in California Exploration Company for every two shares in Northern Ontario Exploration Company.

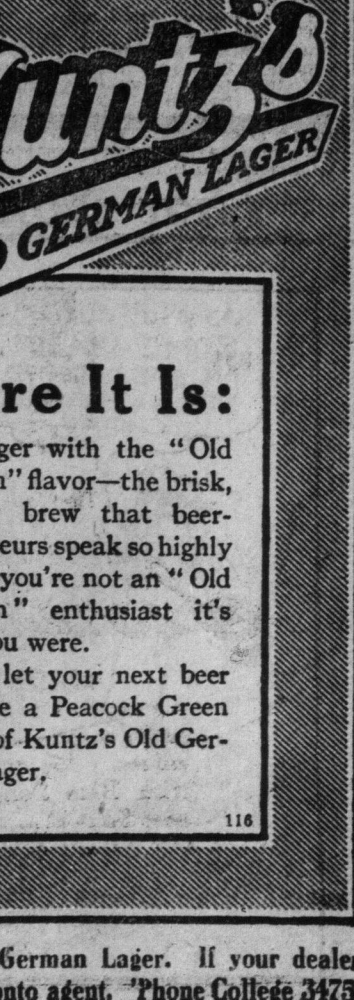
