Advance Made Toward Form ing Gold Pool, Another Hopeful Sign.

STEEL ORDERS POOR

Some Demand for Copper Created by Lower Prices Quoted.

NEW YORK, Sept. 23 .- Financial developments of the day, or far as they bere upon domestic conditions, were of a hopeful character. The outcome of the New York City \$100,000,000 loan, with the notes already quoted at a substantial premium, and the energy manifested by the leading bankers of the country in connection with the gold pool, were regarded as sure indications

of returning confidence.

There was a renewal of the gold movement to Canada, over \$3,000,000 being shipped to Ottawa, presumably in connection with the city loan, to which participants paid their second instalment today.

instalment today.

Foreign exchange moved uncertainly again, early bills being sold under yesterday's rates, but rebounding later on an unexpected demand for cotton bills, some of which, it was said, were for Postir and Hamburg. In the local for Berlin and Hamburg. In the local money market loans were made with

money market loans were made with more freedom, some at 6 per cent. Another feature was the better demand for commercial paper, at a shade under that rate, by interior banks.

Steel Trade Lags.

The weekly reviews of the steel trade authorities furnished the only discordant note of the day, it being fiatly declared that conditions have grown worse instead of better. Consumers, it was asserted, are well provided for the balance of the year and the money market is calculated to rethe money market is calculated to restrict new buying. It is not denied that there have been price concessions in some products. Lower prices have stimulated a better demand for cop-per, but the further curtailment of operations at Michigan and Montana points of production is viewed as an infallible barometer of the adverse conditions in that industry.

Despite a reduction in operating ex-penses of almost \$700,000, the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad reported a net loss for August of \$235,000.

Cables from London touching upor the efforts under way to resume trading there on a modified basis were re-ceived with much interest. It was still the conservative opinion that no attempt should be made to reopen the local exchange until the British mora-torium is lifted and greater ease is to the international money
