## ESTIMATES ON MECHANICAL FILTERS FOR EAST AND WEST TORONTO WILL BE OBTAINED

Proposal to Give a Supply of Pure Water at Once Was Defeated, and Residents in the Two Suburbs Must Wait a Long Time For It.

A lively debate was precipitated by iderman Yeoman's motion to request commissioner of Works Harris to seek stimates on the cost of mechanical litration plants to be installed at the pumping stations in East and West foronto.

Ald. Yeomans stated that the commissioner has reported that the water bhained from the Humber Bay and itsributed thruout the western district was in an unsanitary condition, which has a standing menace to. not only the people in the west, but, when an intergency arose, the possibility of a lever epidemic pervading the whole sity, because of the proposition to connect the central system by a 36-inch main. As to the east the alderman referred to the report, and stated that the water taken from the lake was in fairly good condition, but the sewage disposal plant would ultimately contaminate the water.
