

In the Exchequer Court to-day Jus-tice Burbidge gave judgment in the Goodwin case. The case was before the Exchequer Court some time ago, when judgment was given for \$57,000, but it was sent baok by the present Government for de-cision on certain legal questions re-served. In his judgment to-day Jus-tice Burbidge decides against Mr. Goodwin. Under section 33 of the con-tract it was provided that a dispute be referred to the Exchequer Court, and therefore it was referred to him un-der that clause.
