The Yukon Question Did Not Come Up, Owing to Premier's Absence-Ontario Liberals Said to Oppose the Proposition-The Drummond Lease to Be Continued-Scalers' Claims-News from the Capital.

Ottawa, May 22.-(Special.)-The Premier has so far recovered from his bronchial attack that he will be present in the House to-morrow. He was not in his place at the Cabinet meeting yesterday, when the supplementary estimates for next year were under consideration.

The Yukon question, owing to Sir Wilfrid Laurier's absence, was not taken up, but the feeling is strong to-day among politicians that the project is dead, for this session. It is believed, however, that the Government will ask Parliament to vote \$200,000 or \$250,000 to McKenzie and Mann as compensation for their loss by the non-ratification of the contract.
