WEEKLY FINANCIAL REPORT.

New York, May 5.—The market was governed throughout the week by cumulative evidence of increasing danger in the foreign situation. The gloomy utterances of government officials, and the candid admissions of representatives of the French and British commissions were accompanied by liquidation of prime securities, notably rails.

A new low record for roubles coincided with the receipt of discurbing rumors from Petrograd and other European points. The reported armistice between Russian and German troops was accepted as further proof of the activity of the Teutonic peace propagation. break of war. 
