

## Medical Inspection Urged for Rural School Children

County Council Will Consider the Appointment of Four Public School Nurses—Defective Eyesight Is Reported To Be Very Prevalent by Inspector.

The June session of the Middlesex County Council opened in the county buildings here yesterday afternoon and will continue throughout the week. Practically every member of the council was present at the opening meeting, and County Warden Thomas Clark presided. The first item on the agenda was the hearing of a female delegation composed of Dr. McNaughton, district president of the North Middlesex Women's Institute, and Mrs. McNaughton, district president of the North Middlesex Women's Institute. As a result of the plea put forward by these women the council will consider the appointment of four public school nurses at once on a motion by Stanley Shaw, seconded by M. F. Clatworthy.

Dr. Smith, the first speaker, opened his address by stating that in the cities medical inspection of public school children is on a sound basis. Are Held Back. "The rural children," he declared, "particularly because of defective eyesight. Medical inspection of rural children has been done by me for five years, and although I am now acting for the Government, I am now the Women's Institute that originated the idea."

"I myself have examined 40,000 children and have found that to prove the value of such inspection. For instance, at Lucas one day last week of 102 children examined 10 had defective eyesight, 8 required glasses at once, 6 others needed attention to their eyes, and 64 were recommended to have cataracts and adenoids removed. I am not a crank, and take the local doctor with me on inspection. They and I are another thing that receives little attention."

Want County Help. "What I want," said Dr. Smith, "is the county council to help us out. Our Government has not yet decided how often we should visit a school. We want nurses to follow up our work. With about 150 rural schools in the county, and 1,300 operations were performed. The educational department will grant \$10 annually per school for this work. For three years the Women's Institute paid every cent for the work, and the county council has been asked to take over the work. Mrs. McNaughton, armed with an array of figures, wanted the county council to take over the work. She stated that four nurses at \$1,200 per year would cost \$4,800, cars for them to visit schools would cost \$200 each, with \$200 each for upkeep, making a total cost for the first year of about \$5,200. As the educational department would pay \$1,800 of this the county would be required to pay \$3,400, with an annual cost thereafter of about \$3,800. She guaranteed that the Women's Institute of Middlesex would provide the necessary medical supplies for the schools.

Cost Is Not Heavy. "It will only mean about one-eighth of the tax rate," she concluded, "and when the council granted."

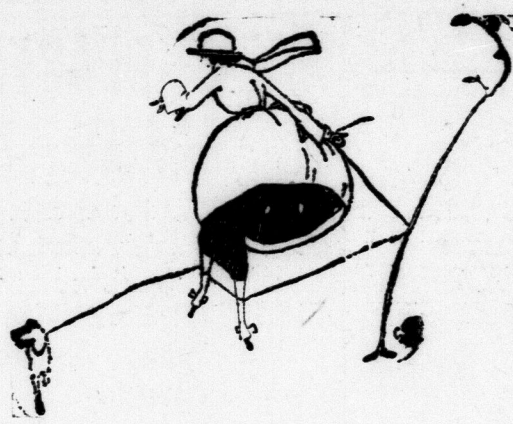
