THREE GERMANS PUT TO  
DEATH AS SPIES OF ALLIES

Amsterdam, Nov. 2.—(Associated  
Press)—Three Germans, including one  
non-commissioned officer, one private,  
and a civil official, have just been ex-  
ecuted in Germany as Entente spies. The  
leader of the group, according to the  
German newspaper accounts, was a Dr.  
Roos. His associates were Joseph Sch-  
nitler, a non-commissioned officer in  
an artillery battalion at the front, and  
Albert Straudel, a soldier in a telephone  
section in Coblenz.

The Kolnische Zeitung gives the fol-  
lowing account of the cases:  
"The enemy espionage service not only  
succeeds in espionage and then sending  
canny subjects and suborned neutrals  
with false or stolen passports to spy in  
Germany, but occasionally a German  
succumbs to the temptation of money."  
"A German court-martial had to deal  
with one of these cases a short time  
ago. The three men named were ac-  
cused of treason. Dr. Roos, who had  
been a failure in his profession and in  
life, while on a business journey to Swit-  
zerland in 1915, made the acquaintance  
of a certain Joseph Kraft, in Geneva,  
French Intelligence Service. Here Dr.  
Roos was also introduced to an alleged  
Captain Barral.

"It was agreed that Roos should set-  
tle in Frankfurt, and from there send  
military and economic information to  
Switzerland to a covering address, Gre-  
villiot, Geneva. The information was  
written by Roos in invisible ink between  
the lines of newspapers which were then  
sent in a wrapper looking quite innocu-  
ous in the post. As a reward for betray-  
ing his country, Roos at once received  
an advance of 2,000 francs, and a month-  
ly payment of 1,000 francs was guaran-  
teed him.

In October, 1915, Roos began his ac-  
tivities in Frankfurt. At first he had his  
own observations only to rely upon, but  
later he gained accomplices in Straudel  
and Schmitler. He sent several reports  
monthly until finally the secret writing  
was discovered, and it was ascertained  
that he was the sender. Soon after-

ward his accomplices were discovered.  
All three made full confession.

"The activities of these three spies  
has done great injury to the Fatherland  
and the army, as the two soldiers, espe-  
cially Schmitler, who was at the front,  
were able to give valuable information.  
The court martial condemned all three  
to death. The punishment was carried  
out soon after.

MR. PORTER'S WITHDRAWAL.  
James E. Porter of Andover, Laurier  
candidate in the federal election, in han-  
dling the returning officer his notice of  
withdrawal, accompanied it with a let-  
ter stating his reasons. He said that his  
nomination paper was made out at  
Grand Falls, and that when he brought  
it to Woodstock he consulted a solicitor,  
who advised him that it was not in  
proper form. He prepared another one,  
but had no time in which to get signa-  
tures. It was filed subject to objection.  
Further advice was that the nomination  
paper was insufficient.
