London, Oct. 21.—Fire which started
late last evening in the Hop Exchange
in Southwark street was still burning
this morning. Damage totalling many
hundreds of thousands of pounds was
done to the exchange. Some estimates
place the loss at \$1,000,000.

STARVE LEGION OF RATS ON LEVIATHAN

Hungry Rodents Put Cats to
Flight and Then Attack
Ship Furnishings.

New York, Oct. 21.—Swarms of rats
made savage by starvation, a means in-
stituted by quarantine officials to en-
courage them, have attacked and put to
flight a large cat family and otherwise
laid havoc aboard the steamship Le-
viathan, formerly the German liner
Vaterland.

Since the Leviathan has been tied
up at a Hoboken pier, where rodent popu-
lation has multiplied into legions and
infested her eleven decks and interior,
"unmanned" was found impracticable by
quarantine officers, who sought to re-
move them, and starvation tactics were
employed some weeks ago. After the
ship's armory was gone, the rats attacked
the ship's furnishings, luxurious leather
upholsters, panels and other fittings be-
gunning gnawed before repair.

Quarantine officers say, however, that
the end is in sight. In their battle for
life, they declared, the rodents would
destroy one another.

U. S. PROHIBITION AGENT SHOT IN SALOON RAID

Baltimore, Md., Oct. 21.—Robert G.
Davidson of this city, a United States
revenue agent, was shot last night in a
raid on the saloon of Hyman Kitzes.
Two other agents, Frank Rafferty of
this city and Fred T. Rose of Washing-
ton, after a hard fight subdued Kitzes,
who is alleged to have done the shoot-
ing. Nine bottles of alleged liquor were
confiscated.

MISSING MAIL BAGS FOUND

Brockville, Ont., Oct. 21.—The mail
bag cleared up to some extent by one
of the officers of the dominion police. A
bag containing bonds to the value of
\$2,000 was found on Saturday in the C.
P. R. yards with the contents intact
and the remaining bag containing mis-
cellaneous matter reached its destina-
tion in Morrisburg, N. Y., safely. The
detective is still trying to ferret out who
tampered with the registered mail, but
so far no clue has been obtained.

BIG SEIZURE IS MADE IN NEW YORK

New York, Oct. 21.—Federal prohibi-
tion enforcement agents made one of the
largest hauls here yesterday when they
seized 400 barrels of wine valued at
\$125,000 at the wholesale store of E.
Mason. Fifty cases of whiskey also were
seized.

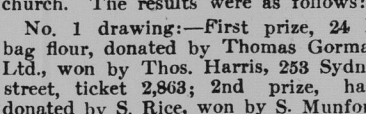
