Montreal Market:

Montreal, Feb. 22.—The Gazette says: "Reference to the Scotia's annual statement to the improvement in the iron and steel business in the last quarter of 1912 should bring some cheer to Dominion Steel holders who saw stocks apparently heading for the cellar yesterday. Scotia, with its year closing on December 31, enjoyed only one good quarter in the year. With Dominion Iron's year closing on March 31st, and the more satisfactory position of the trade with respect to United States dumping and prices being well maintained, the corporation will have two quarters of at least fairly satisfactory business. The close of the previous year was under directly opposite conditions.

"With United States Steel around 61, and Dominion Steel around 52 1/2, the iron and steel business must apparently be in a bad way. As a matter of fact both companies are operating to their full capacity, unable to meet all the demands being made upon them and enjoying prices substantially higher than a year ago. To what extent at the moment the pressure of United States dumping is removed, as indicated by the fact that customers of the United States Steel Corporation in Canada are complaining that deliveries are at the rate of only 20 to 30 per cent. of the goods contracted.

"The statement of the Nova Scotia Steel and Coal Company for the year 1912 given out after a meeting of the directors here yesterday showed that, despite a greatly increased volume of business, profits for the year were smaller by \$18,383 than profits in 1911. The figures were \$1,009,050 in 1912 as compared with \$1,019,592 in the previous year, and \$1,140,504 in 1910."

WOMAN WHO IS A MEMBER OF THE LEGISLATURE

(Woman's Journal).

Rising to a question of personal privilege soon after the Colorado senate had convened on February 6, Senator Helen Ring Robinson took to task John Hecker, former secretary of the Liquor Sellers' Association, who recently asserted that Colorado women drink and smoke more than men. Mrs. Robinson had not heard Hecker make his statement in broken English, and had not known of it until a friend in Washington had sent her a newspaper clipping.

"I take this first opportunity which presents itself since learning the facts of the case," she said, according to the Denver Republican, "to denounce it publicly as a reckless statement, made in utter disregard of truth. There may be one place in all Denver where the statement is true. In the Street of Forbidden Things, in the red penitents of lust souls and ruined bodies, it may be that the prostitute women do indeed drink more cocktails and highballs than even the prostitute men.

"But, Mr. President, however that may be, I protest that if the senator from the First garners his information from the mark and slime of such places, he has no right to spread such information over the

records of this honorable body. He has no right to use it as a means of libeling my sisters and your wives and daughters. He has no right thus to spread broadcast such a vicious attack on the womanhood of Colorado.

"I protest against such a statement being allowed to pass unchallenged. It is not enough to say as a man did to his last night—'Oh, he isn't responsible. We know the senator from the First.' But, Mr. President, the people of the East do not know him. They cannot discount his utterances as we have learned to do.

"Mr. President, the women of Colorado need no defense from me. I have lived among them for twenty years. I am proud of the friendliness of many women toilers. I am glad of the friendliness of many whose paths lie among gentler ways. I can compare them with the women of New England, where I was born, with the women of the Middle West, where I have also lived, and with the women of various European cities. And I protest that the women of Colorado are surpassed by none of them in all true womanly qualities, and that many of them have in addition a breadth of vision, a range of sympathies far less general among their sisters of Europe or their sisters in the east—the result, I believe, of that equality of citizen-

ship which has been theirs for nearly twenty years.

"Henceforth I shall change my conduct when the Senator says the first class to speak. I also shall rise, and take a seat nearer him—where, by straining my ears, I may, perhaps, be able to understand his meaning. And if ever again he dares to attack the womanhood of Colorado as he did last night, I serve notice here and now that I shall introduce a resolution asking for his expulsion, as a menace to the dignity of the senate, a menace to the good name of the state."
