Thus does H. G. Acres, of Niagara Falls, consulting engineer of the N. B. Power Commission, conclude his exhaustive report on the proposed Grand Falls hydro electric development, a report which was submitted to the members of the N. B. Legislature at an informal session this morning.

The Acres report points out that the original estimate of the commission engineers on the total cost of a 60,000 horsepower plant at Grand Falis was \$6,758,060, and estimate of Mr. Acres for a 75,000 horsepower plant with 50,000 horsepower installed, totals \$6,402,217

In the original report of the Commission's engineers the total construction cost of 80,000 horsepower plant was estimated to be \$7,719,000, while the Acres report estimates the cost for completely installed plant of 75,000 orsepower at \$7,245,100.

Discussing the type of development Mr. Acres says it is proposed to include in the initial stage of the development a pressure tunnel of sufficient capacity to accommodate, under an average annual load factor of 65 to 70 per cent. of all dependable regulated flow derived from the development of domestic and international storage to this tunnel, will be ultimately connected three hydro electric units of 25,000 electrical horsepower capacity each, or an aggregate of 75,000 electrical horsepower.
