FIRST EDITION. RAILWAY WAR IMPENDING.

RESULT OF THE QUARREL OVER DRESSING BEEF WATER.

Chairman Fallisworth Makes a Decision That May Bring on a Serious Conflict Between Western Roads.

Chicago, Ill., June 10.—The quarrel over dressed beef rates in which the eastern roads are engaged has resulted in the withdrawal from the Chicago & Grand Trunk from the Central Traffic Association...

The officials of that road have become incensed at Chairman Fallisworth for refusing to authorize them to protect their differential rates...

They will now make such rates as they see fit without notifying the association in advance of their intention.

Some time ago the interstate commerce commission decided that lines situated as are the Alton, St. Paul and Kansas City road, ending at the Missouri river...

The proportion of through rates quoted by competitors between the same points is about 75 per cent.

The Freight Association have not been compelled to meet this situation in a way which would have been considered to be the St. Paul road \$100 on 18 different complaints...

It is believed that the Western roads have agreed to about 75 per cent of all business from the West to Chicago...

Chairman Fallisworth's decision is the most important in many years in the history of the freight association...

It may bring on the most serious conflict in which the western roads have ever engaged...
