SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Provinces, excepting 8 and 28, not reserved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, or to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less. Entry may be made personally at the land office, or by a proxy in which the land to be taken is situated. HOMESTEAD DUTIES: A settler who has been granted an entry for land is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one of the following plans: (A) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years. If the settler is deceased, his widow or child, or if the father (or mother, if the settler is deceased) is unable to make a homestead entry under the provisions of this Act, resides upon a term in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act in respect of residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother. If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residing on such farming land. APPLICATION FOR PATENT should be made at the end of three years, before the local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Home-land Inspector. Before making application for patent the settler must give six months' notice, in writing, to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention to do so. SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST MINING REGULATIONS. (a) Coal lands may be purchased at \$100 per acre for soft coal, and \$200 per acre for hard coal. Not more than 200 acres can be acquired by one individual or company. Royalty at the rate of ten cents per acre of 200 pounds shall be collected on the gross output. (b) Quartz—A free miner's certificate is granted upon payment in advance of \$5 per annum, for an individual and from \$10 to \$100 per annum for a company according to capital. (c) A free miner, having discovered mineral in place, may locate a claim 1,500x1,500 feet. The fee for recording a claim is \$5. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may, upon having a survey made and upon complying with other requirements, purchase the land at an auction. The patent provides for the payment of \$100 per acre for 2 1/2 years on the sales. (d) PLACER mining claims generally are 100 feet square; entry fee \$5, renewable for one year.
