I have the honor to submit
herewith my report for the month
now ended. I am pleased to state
that the Indians in this Agency
were never in better circumstances.
Some of the Bands will have ample
flour, to support them for nearly
one year providing that the grain
is not spoiled by heating. There
is little or no sickness, save some
chronic diseases, where medical aid
does but little good. Measles are
prevalent in the district, but as yet
have not reached the Reserves.

With the exception of Poundmaker
and Little Pine Bands, the Indians
are contented and happy the
